A 5 YEAR VISION FOR CONNECTION, CHARACTER & KIDS



Last Advent, our parish witnessed a miracle of generosity. In response to a significant budget deficit, we set a goal of raising \$50,000, but received over \$75,000 in gifts. Your generosity reminded me of Jesus' miracle of transforming water into wine. You had saved the best for last and we celebrated with jubilation at your outpouring of financial support. Your generosity not only allowed us to overturn our budget deficit, it allowed us to rebuild. We hired a new music director, we undertook some important repairs to our building, we invested in hosting a Movie Night on our Hill. But most importantly, it gave us the stability to dream about our future once again.

Last year in our Stewardship Campaign, I quoted from the musical South Pacific, where a character sings, "If you don't have a dream, how you gunna have a dream come true?" This year has been a year to dream and discern where God is leading us as a Church. And it has been a year to create a vision and a plan that moves us towards that goal. In the next five years, I invite you to join me as we dream about how to "Transfig the Hill."

Transfig the Hill is a five-year vision and plan to re-focus our mission and write a new chapter in our parish life. It builds off our desire to make 'the Hill' a place of connection, but dreams of moving beyond a point of connection to the building of relationships between Hill visitors and the Church. As I watch the activity on our Hill, I see three key areas where we can transform our mission to our neighbours.

First, rebuild our Children's Ministry to welcome the growing number of young families in our neighbourhood. Second, connect our Church and Hill by building a beautiful and accessible pathway to our entrance. Third, create a distinct character for the Hill that reflects our Church community and makes our green space more than a neighbourhood park.

We have set the goal of raising \$40,000 annually over the next 5 years as we seek to Transfig the Hill for missional growth. We have already witnessed the opportunity that our Hill offers us to be a place of connection in our neighbourhood. Now we aim to invite these neighbours from steps on the Hill to steps in the journey of faith.

As a Church, we gather on the Hill to learn about the transformative power of God's grace in our lives through Jesus Christ. Let's equip ourselves with the resources to share this gift, so that we might build up the next generation of parishioners and continue the work of raising up new Disciples of Christ on the Hill.










Create a beautiful and accessible pathway to **Connect** our Garden Doors and the Hill and knit together our indoor and outdoor space for ministry and mission.




Create a distinctively **Christian Character** to the Hill that distinguishes our space from a city park through intentional choices for benches, gardens, lighting, signage and art.







Character

Many visitors see our Hill as a park. Differentiating our green space through a unique **Christian Character** is the second objective of Transfig the Hill. How can we offer welcome and hospitality to our neighbours in a way that also invites reflection and extends our Church beyond our building?

Instead of a park bench, can we reuse old **pew** benches? The unmistakable style of the pews will give a distinctive character to our Hill. Can we dedicate these benches to past parishioners? Can we engrave Scripture on them?

We have a beautiful indoor space; can we illuminate our **stain glass** windows at night to provide visual beauty to our Hill, invite passers-by to pause and maybe 2025 even come inside?

Or could we imagine how art could be used to create a distinctively Christian character? For example, through a prayer corner, labyrinth, or sculpture?

And before we break ground for the accessible entrance, let's transplant our much loved gardens beds.





This summer, God surprised us. One Sunday, I looked out and counted eight children on the Hill. We quickly brought out our children's materials and set up the Children's Chapel. Every Sunday, volunteer teachers, with the assistance of the older children, teach the next generation of children the stories of the Bible.

In October, we started two new programs: First Fridays is our once-a-month, all ages drop-in with games, activities and a whole lot of fun, spear-headed by our People's Warden, Patti. Tots at Transfig, is a Saturday morning drop in for young families. This initiative from Jessica, a new mother in our parish, offers community and creative play to cooped up families in nearby apartments. Thirteen toddlers and their parents dropped in on opening day.

The Harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. Transfig the Hill seeks to place children and families back at the centre of our mission. This fall has demonstrated to us that there is a need in our neighbourhood and that with resources, personnel,

and planning, we can become a place where children grow in the knowledge and love

of God.




